The National Commission for Women conducted final Consultation on "Review of Criminal Law-Improvement in Status of Women" in February, 2022. The objective of the Consultation was to review and analyze the position of law; and formulate consolidated recommendations for viable amendments keeping in view the perspective and position of women in India. A Region Consultation was also held at Department of Law, Panjab University. The Consultations aim at identifying recommendations for suitable amendments in the law. NCW invited eminent speakers from the field of law and civil society organisations for the deliberation

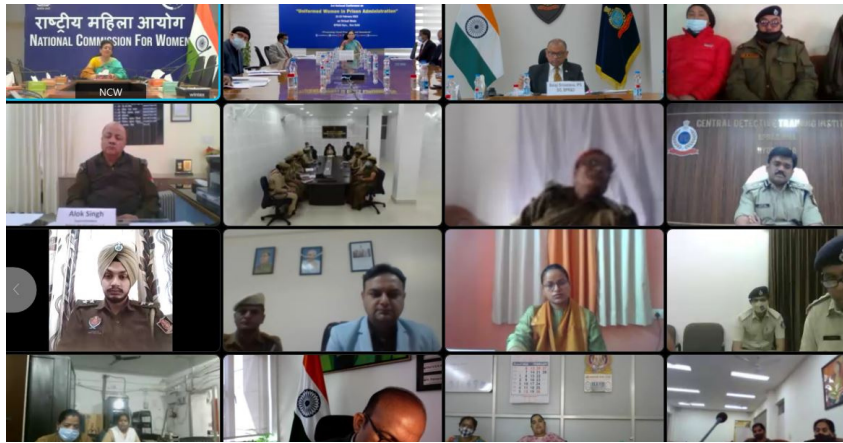

NCW team visits protesting Anganwadi workers



A three-member team formed by the National Commission for Women visited the protesting Anganwadi workers in Delhi on February 23 to check availability of basic amenities like drinking water and toilets at the site and to ensure the safety and security of the protesting women. The NCW team inspected the protest site and interacted with the Anganwadi workers, who have been protesting outside CM Arvind Kejriwal's office since January 31.

Women in Dairy Farming



NCW organised four training sessions on 'Dairy Farming & Value Added Dairy Products', two in the state of Tamil Nadu, and one each in Karnataka and Gujarat. These 5-day training programs were conducted in the month of February in collaboration with Krishi Vigyan Kendra under the University of Agricultural Sciences, Bengaluru, Tamilnadu Agricultural University and Navsari Agricultural University, Gujarat.
